




OUT OF OUR PAST

Tedcastle Friendship Ouilt

In November 2023 the Historical Committee was given a quilt which had been donated by Brian Tedcastle and his wife, Jennifer, of Barnstead, New Hampshire. Brian is the grandson of Rev. Arthur and Ethel Tedcastle who served our Stratford UMC from 1963-1973. Barnstead is the town in which Arthur owned his summer cottage, just up the road from the Suncook Lakes. The quilt was given to Art and Ethel to celebrate the newly built church and Arthur's retirement in 1973.

The Friendship Quilt was made by a committee of quilters led by Edith Cornelius and Ethel Kimball. The group made patchwork quilts. Congregational members were invited to purchase a 6" cotton white or blue square for \$1.00, sign their names and elaborate as they wished. The signatures and designs were embroidered by the purchasers themselves or by a committee member. Then they were pieced together into the quilt and the quilt was tied. The center features an embroidered picture of the newly built church, taken from the architectural drawing as in fact the bell tower had not yet been built in 1972. In October 1972 there was a note in the Chatterbox (the newsletter of the United Methodist Women) that "the squares coming in are just so beautiful and all so very different and original." The Wintons put a pie on their square, others put their first names in creative ways with their last, some have flowers, another a quotation. In the November 1972 Chatterbox Edith Cornelius said the committee "would like to thank everyone for contributing their 'talents' to the Friendship Ouilt."

The Historical Committee will be displaying the quilt for all to see from April 14 - 28 in the Narthex. There are 14 rows of squares with a total of 152 squares in the quilt. With the help of some "old timers" lists have been complied of the names on every square. One list is alphabetical, the other by row and column. There are a few which we are unsure of the complete name. We invite you to view the quilt. Did you or someone in your family do a square? A parent, a grandparent? Do you remember any of the other folks? Can you help us name the remaining ones?


