Hello, I'm a newcomer to your church:

You cannot know the reason I am here this morning. It may be as simple as a move to your community or as complicated as a personal crisis that leads me to seek strength from God. In either case, I am here. I will probably remain here and come back to worship with you next Sunday and the Sunday after that if you will do something for me. Won't you please?

Smile at me as I walk in your door. You are my first impression of the church, and this impression will probably stay with me for a long time.

Speak to me. I know you want to see your friends and settle that piece of committee business, but I may find it hard to believe that you truly care for "the stranger in your midst"!

Tell me good things about your church and minister. I want to believe that I have come to some place where people love each other and where they believe that they are doing something exciting and important for the Lord!

Notice me if I am not a family. I don't want to feel invisible just because I am unmarried, a single parent, a teenager or an elderly person.

Talk to me again the second week when I come back, and the third and the fourth. I am still not a part of your church family. Please don't feel you have "done your duty" by me just because you made a point of greeting me the first week I was here.

Invite me to become part of some church group or organization. I need more than worship each Sunday. I need to know that I am accepted and affirmed by the group of people within the church who know me by my first name and who care about me as an individual.

For "starters" invite me to coffee hour after church. If I accept, look for me at the conclusion of the service and introduce me to others.

If you can find it in your heart to do these things for me, **I will come back** ... the second Sunday, the third... and maybe forever! I will worship with you. I may find Christ for the first time and make a commitment to Him! I will see what it is like for Christians to live and work together.

Friendship Quilt on Display Through June



A Friendship Quilt made by a committee of quilters led by Edith Cornelius and Ethel Kimball was presented to the Rev. Arthur and Ethel Tedcastle in 1972 in celebration of the new sanctuary. Congregational members were invited to purchase a 6" cotton white or blue square for \$1.00, sign their names and elaborate as they wished. The signatures and designs were embroidered by the purchasers themselves or by a committee member. Then they were pieced together into the quilt and the quilt was tied. The center features an embroidered picture of the newly built church, taken from the architectural drawing as in fact the bell tower had not yet been built in 1972.

The Historical Committee will be displaying the quilt in the narthex for all to see through June; there are 14 rows of squares, with a total count of 152 squares. An alphabetical list of the names is available so you can find your name.


5. Rev. Melville S. Bulmer, 1935-1960.

Strawberry Pretzel Surprise (Salad).

or

Originally in the UMW Cookbook as Jello Surprise, submitted by Jean Lanz. Prepared for Arts and Crafts Salad Luncheon by Pat Knebel

Base: 2 ½ cups (8 oz bag) of salted pretzels, crushed 3/4 cup butter, melted 3 tablespoons sugar

Cream filling: 1 cup sugar 8 oz. cream cheese 2 cups (8 oz.) cool whip 1 cup sugar 8 oz. cream cheese 1 envelope whipped topping (Dream Whip) ½ cup cold milk 1 teaspoon vanilla

Fruit layer: 2 cups boiling water

1 large (6 oz.) package of strawberry Jello

Large bag, 32 oz, of frozen strawberries (or strawberry, blueberry, raspberry mix, or any combo of berries, even peaches. Strawberry and Blueberry are great for 4th of July.)

Crush pretzels, add melted butter and sugar. Spread in greased 9" x 13" pan. Bake at 357^o for 8 minutes. Let cool.

Cream together the sugar and cream cheese. When smooth add the cool whip, or whipped topping prepared as to package directions with vanilla.

Spread on the cooled pretzel base. Allow to set and prepare Jello.

Add the 2 cups of boiling water to the strawberry Jello. Stir to dissolve. Add frozen bag of berries, stir, and let stand until starts to thicken. About 10-15 minutes.

Pour over the cream mixture.

Refrigerate about 2 hours or overnight.
